The Barre Housing Authority administers three housing programs: Public Housing (Elderly and Disabled), Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program, and Project Based Vouchers. Public Housing units are owned and operated by the Barre Housing Authority. The Housing Choice Voucher Program is for rental units in the private market program, and a housing assistance payment is paid to the landlord on behalf of the resident. BHA also administers project-based vouchers in certain privately-owned affordable housing developments, which may have additional eligibility requirements and preferences. Further information regarding waiting lists, income-targeting and local preferences will be provided upon request.

***All applicants are encouraged to apply for all programs.** Please check the space provided on the top of your housing application (Sec 8, PBV and/or PHA). Also, please indicate the bedroom size you applied for. Should you check that you want a one-bedroom apartment, if at any time you would consider an efficiency (0 bedroom) apartment, please contact our office, as you can always transfer to a one-bedroom apartment when one becomes available (elderly/disabled applicants only)

***There are five eligibility requirements for admission to public housing:** 1) qualifies as a family; 2) has an income within the limits; 3) meets citizenship/eligible immigrant criteria; 4) provides documentation of social security numbers; and 5) signed consent authorization documents. In addition to the eligibility criteria, families must also meet the BHA screening criteria, landlord references, and credit/criminal background checks, in order to be admitted to public housing.

To be eligible for admission to public housing developments in any fiscal year, not less than 40 percent shall be occupied by families whose incomes at the time commencement of occupancy do not exceed 30 percent of the area median income, as described by the Secretary of HUD. Income limits information is available upon request.

Once the BHA has met the 40% target income requirements for the new admissions of extremely low-income families in public housing, the BHA will fill the remainder of its new admissions with families with both low and very low incomes.

Housing Choice Voucher Program (Section 8): BHA will select families based on families with income needed to achieve the de-concentration of poverty and income mixing and victims of domestic violence. To be eligible for participation under the Housing Choice Voucher Program in any fiscal year, not less than 75% shall be selected by applicants whose income, at the time of voucher issuance, does not exceed 30 percent of the area median income.

Once your completed application is received in our office, it will be placed on our waiting list under pending status until your eligibility can be determined. **Some common delays in processing applications are:** failing to sign all required documents (minimum of four places); not submitting two forms of identification on all adult members of the household; failing to submit verification of social security cards on all family members; not providing complete name and mailing addresses of income sources and landlord references.

Some applicants with disabilities may need a **reasonable accommodation** in order to take full advantage of the Barre Housing Authority housing programs and related services. When such accommodations are granted, they do not confer special treatment advantage for the person with a disability; rather, they make housing and programs accessible in a way that would otherwise not be possible due to their disability. Notice of Right to Reasonable Accommodation is attached to your application. Because disabilities are not always apparent, the BHA will ensure that all applicants/tenants are aware of the opportunity to request reasonable accommodation.

Project Based Voucher: The following developments currently have project-based subsidies. If you are interested in any of these developments and meet the eligibility requirements for the development, please check the appropriate box to be added to the waiting list. Please note that some developments have referral requirements from other agencies, eligibility requirements and preferences in addition to the Section 8 HCV program requirements.

Green Acres (Family Public Housing):

50 units of family housing, built in 1971. Townhouse style. Playground, basketball court, fenced in backyards. Hookups for washers and dryers in each unit. There is a community space with coin-op laundry. Heat, electric, trash, and hot water included. 2, 3, and 4 bedroom units. 3 handicapped accessible units with elevator. No assigned parking, limited visitor parking available.

Elderly/Disabled (Public Housing)

- **Washington Apartments** (14 Washington St, Barre, VT 05641): Renovated in 1970. 46 apartments; 18 efficiency apartments, 27 one-bedroom apartments (3 handicap accessible units), 1 two-bedroom apartment. Balconies for efficiency apartments only. Laundry facilities on every other floor (even floors; 2,4,6). Trash chute on each floor. Community room and activities available. Heat, electric, trash, and hot water included. Elevator available. Assigned limited parking, NO visitor parking.
- **Jefferson Apartments** (26 Jefferson Street, Barre, VT 05641): Built in 1976. 24 one-bedroom apartments. Laundry facilities on first floor, trash chute on each floor. Community room, patio, and garden available. Elevator available. Heat, electric, trash, and hot water included. Assigned limited parking, reserved at Jefferson or Washington. NO visitor parking.
- **North Barre Manor** (455 North Main Street, Barre, VT 05641): Built in 1982. 120 one-bedroom apartments. Elevator available. Laundry facilities and trash chute on each floor. Community room and activities available. Heat, electric, trash, and hot water included. Assigned limited parking for residents only, NO visitor parking.
- **Quarry Hill** (604 Graniteville Road, Graniteville, VT 05654): Built in 1985. 30 garden style (ground level, one floor) apartments in 5 buildings. Country setting. Laundry facilities in each building. Community building and garden spaces available. Heat, electric, trash, AC, and hot water included. Assigned parking for residents and limited visitor parking.
- **Avery Apartments** (170 Mill Street, East Barre, VT 05649): Built in 1986. 15 garden style (ground level, one floor) one-bedroom apartments in two buildings. Country setting. Community building and garden spaces available. Laundry facilities in community building. Heat, electric, trash, AC, and hot water included. Assigned parking for residents, limited visitor parking.

Barre Housing Authority has ONE waitlist for all elderly/disabled public housing properties. Our wait list goes by the date and time we receive the application in office.

Things You Should Know

Don't risk your chances for Federally assisted housing by providing false, incomplete, or inaccurate information on your application forms.

Purpose	This is to inform you that there is certain information you must provide when applying for assisted housing. There are penalties that apply if you knowingly omit information or give false information.

Asking Questions	When you meet with the person who is to fill out your application, you should know what is expected of you. If you do not understand something, ask for clarification. That person can answer your question or find out what the answer is.

Completing The Application	When you answer application questions, you must include the following information:

Income ▫ All sources of money you or any member of your household receive (wages, welfare payments, alimony, social security, pension, etc.):

- Any money you receive on behalf of your children (child support, social security for children, etc.);
- Income from assets (interest from a savings account, credit union, or certificate of deposit; dividends from stock, etc.);

- Earnings from second job or part time job;
- Any anticipated income (such as a bonus or pay raise you expect to receive)

Assets ▫ All bank accounts, savings bonds, certificates of deposit, stocks, real estate, etc.. that are owned by you and any adult member of your family's household who will be living with you.

- Any business or asset you sold in the last 2 years for less than its full value, such as your home to your children.
- The names of all of the people (adults and children) who will actually be living with you, whether or not they are related to you.

Signing the Application

- Do not sign any form unless you have read it, understand it, and are sure everything is complete and accurate.
- When you sign the application and certification forms, you are claiming that they are complete to the best of your knowledge and belief. You are committing fraud if you sign a form knowing that it contains false or misleading information.
- Information you give on your application will be verified by your housing agency. In addition, HUD may do computer matches of the income you report with various Federal, State, or private agencies to verify that it is correct.

Recertifications

You must provide updated information at least once a year. Some programs require that you report any changes in income or family/household composition immediately. Be sure to ask when you must recertify. You must report on recertification forms:

- All income changes, such as increases of pay and/or benefits, change or loss of job and/or benefits, etc., for all household members.
- Any move in or out of a household member; and,
- All assets that you or your household members own and any assets that was sold in the last 2 years for less than its full value.

Beware of Fraud

You should be aware of the following fraud schemes:

- Do not pay any money to file an application;
- Do not pay any money to move up on the waiting list;
- Do not pay for anything not covered by your lease;
- Get a receipt for any money you pay; and,
- Get a written explanation if you are required to pay for anything other than rent (such as maintenance charges).

Reporting Abuse

If you are aware of anyone who has falsified an application, or if anyone tries to persuade you to make false statements, report them to the manager of your complex or your PHA. If that is not possible, then call the local HUD office or the HUD Office of Inspector General (OIG) Hotline at (800) 347-3735. You can also write to:

ITEMS TO BRING TO THE INTERVIEW OR MAIL WITH APPLICATION

You will need to bring three original forms of identification on all adult family members (one being a social security card, birth certificate and drivers license), and on all minor family members we will need two original forms of identification (one being social security card and birth certificate).

A Information About Your Income and Assets

1. ***Employment Income.*** For every member of your family who works, bring the following information:
 - Name, address, telephone number of the employer.
 - Current rate of regular pay and overtime pay and the number of hours per week normally worked (three current pay stubs).
 - Information about any changes you expect in your pay or the number of hours worked during the next twelve months.
 - Other type of income you expect to receive from employment, such as tips, commissions, profit-sharing programs, etc.

2. ***Benefit and Support Income.*** If any member of your family receives any of the following types of income, bring name, address, and telephone number of the source of the income and information about the amount received, as well as check stubs or statements detailing amounts received:
 - Unemployment Compensation
 - Social Security
 - Supplemental Social Security
 - Pension
 - Disability Income
 - Alimony
 - Child Support
 - Welfare or other public assistance
 - Regular support from family members or friends

3. ***Amounts in Savings and Checking Accounts*** (including Christmas Clubs, Certificates of Deposit, IRA and Keogh Accounts). Bring the account number for all accounts and the balance in your accounts. Bring your current statement if at all possible.

4. **Real Estate You Own.** Bring information about the current value of the property. If you own property and rent it, bring the address of the property and information about how much income you receive and what expenses you have for the property. (Bring last year's Schedule E from your income tax forms.)
5. **Stocks, Bonds, Trusts, Other Investments.** Bring account numbers and statements on value of investments and information about income from investments.
6. **Life Insurance Policies.** Bring name of company and policy numbers.
7. **Other Income.** For any other type of income your family has, bring the name, address, and telephone number of the source of the income and information about the amount of the income.
8. **Assets sold or given away.** If you have sold or given away any assets in the past two years (such as giving a property or an amount of money to another family member), please bring information about those assets.

B. Information about Family Members

1. **Age.** Bring a birth certificate or other proof of age if the head or spouse is 62 years of age or older, if you do not receive benefits which prove your age.
2. **Children.** Bring birth certificates, custody agreement, adoption papers, or other proof that the children are members of this household.
3. **Full-time Students.** If any family members are 18 years of age or older and still attending school full time, bring information about where they go to school.
4. **Handicap or Disability.** If any member of your family is handicapped or disabled, bring information about any income the member received because of his/her disability.
5. **Displacement.** If you indicated on your preapplication that your family has recently been displaced by government action, bring information about that situation.

C. Expenses

Bring information about any of the following expenses you expect to have during the next twelve months:

1. **Medical Expenses Not Covered by Insurance.** (Elderly families only).
2. **Medical Insurance premiums** or amounts deducted from your pay for medical insurance. (Elderly families only).
3. **Childcare expenses** to care for your children while you work or go to school.
4. **Handicapped/disability expenses** to care for a handicapped or disabled family member while you work.

WHAT ARE THE LIMITATIONS OF VAWA?

Housing agencies and owners retain the authority to terminate the tenancy, occupancy
or program assistance of a victim under either of the following conditions:

1. The termination is for a lease violation premised on something other than an act of
domestic violence, sexual assault, dating violence, or stalking against the victim, and
the housing agency or owners holding the victim to a standard no more "demanding"
than the standard to which other tenants are held.

2. The housing agency or owner can demonstrate an "actual and imminent threat" to
other tenants or those employed at or providing service to the property" if the tenancy,
occupancy, or program assistance of the victim is not terminated.

In summary, VAWA prevents housing agencies and owners from considering actual
or threatened domestic violence, sexual assault, dating violence, or stalking as a cause for
terminating the tenancy, occupancy, or program assistance of the victim. Such violence
or stalking may not be considered (1) as a serious or repeated violation of the lease by
the victim, (2) as other good cause for terminating the tenancy or occupancy rights of the
victim, or (3) as criminal activity justifying the termination of the tenancy, occupancy
rights, or program assistance of the victim. VAWA 2013 requires a HUD-developed notice
of rights under VAWA to be provided at the time of denial or admission, upon notification
of eviction or termination of assistance, and in multiple languages.

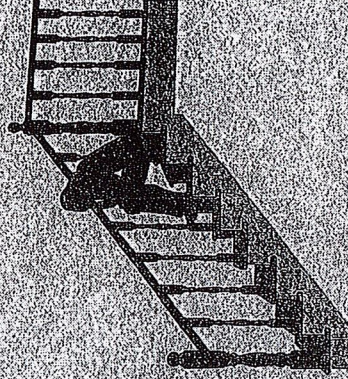

VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN IN FEDERALLY FUNDED RENTAL ASSISTED HOUSING



Learn About Your Rights
as a Victim of
Domestic Violence

BACKGROUND

On November 16, 2016, HUD published in the Federal Register the final rule implementing housing provisions under the Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act of 2013 (VAWA) as it applies to HUD programs. The rule codifies VAWA core protections across covered HUD programs to ensure individuals are not denied assistance, evicted, or have their assistance terminated because of their status as victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault and stalking, or for being affiliated with a victim. The information contained in this brochure is intended to inform you of your rights and responsibilities under VAWA.

DEFINITIONS

Domestic violence includes felony or misdemeanor crimes of violence committed by:

1. a current or former spouse or intimate partner of the victim, the term "spouse or intimate partner of the victim" includes a person who is or has been in a social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature with the victim, as determined by the length of the relationship, the type of the relationship, and the frequency of interaction between the persons involved in the relationship,
 2. a person with whom the victim shares a child,
 3. a person who is cohabiting with or has cohabited with the victim as a spouse or intimate partner,
 4. a person similarly situated to a spouse of the victim under the domestic or family violence laws of the jurisdiction receiving grant monies, or
 5. any other person against an adult or youth victim who is protected from that person's acts under the domestic or family violence laws of the jurisdiction.
- Sexual assault means any nonconsensual sexual act prohibited by Federal, Tribal, or State law, including when the victim lacks capacity to consent.**
- Dating violence means violence committed by a person:**
1. Who is or has been in a social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature with the victim; and
 2. Where the existence of such a relationship shall be determined based on a consideration of the following factors:
 - a. the length of the relationship;
 - b. the type of relationship; and
 - c. the frequency of interaction between the persons involved in the relationship.
- Stalking means engaging in a course of conduct directed at a specific person that would cause a reasonable person to:**
1. Fear for the person's individual safety or the safety of others; or
 2. Suffer substantial emotional distress.
- Affiliated individual, with respect to an individual, means:**
1. A spouse, parent, brother, sister, or child of that individual, or a person to whom that individual stands in the place of a parent or guardian (for example, the affiliated individual is a person in the care, custody, or control of that individual), or

2. Any individual, tenant, or lawful occupant living in the household of that individual.
- Discard means to divide a lease as a matter of law, subject to the permissibility of such process under the requirements of the applicable HUD-covered program and State or local law, such that certain tenants or lawful occupants can be evicted or removed and the remaining tenants or lawful occupants can continue to reside in the unit under the same lease requirements or as may be revised depending upon the eligibility for continued occupancy of the remaining tenants and lawful occupants.**

WHO MAY RECEIVE VAWA PROTECTIONS?

VAWA protections cover tenants and assisted families, as defined under applicable program regulations. VAWA protections also cover applicants when they are applying for admission to a covered housing program.

VAWA protections are not limited to women. Victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking are eligible to protections without regard to sex, gender identity, or sexual orientation. Victims cannot be discriminated against on the basis of any protected characteristics, including race, color, national origin, religion, sex, familial status, disability, or age, and HUD programs must also be operated consistently with HUD's Equal Access Rule, which requires that HUD-assisted and HUD-insured housing are made available to all otherwise eligible individuals and families regardless of actual or perceived sexual orientation, gender identity, or marital status.

A PHA or owner may find instances of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking against youth (those under the age of 18 years old) living in an assisted household for which the family may need to exercise VAWA protections to protect the youth victim. PHAs and owners should exercise the same documentation and confidentiality procedures in assisting a family in such a situation.

WHAT PROTECTIONS ARE PROVIDED BY VAWA?

There are two areas of protection for those persons seeking or receiving assistance under the federally funded public housing program or voucher program.

1. Denial of Assistance – The law provides that you cannot be denied assistance because you are a victim of domestic violence, sexual assault, dating violence, or stalking, or for being affiliated with the victim if you are otherwise qualified to receive such assistance.
2. Termination of Tenancy or Assistance – The law further protects those who are currently receiving federal housing assistance from losing assistance or housing solely on the basis of their status as a victim of domestic violence, sexual assault, dating violence, or stalking, or for being affiliated with the victim. VAWA 2013 adds protections for tenants remaining after the removal of an abuser, allowing them an opportunity to establish program eligibility, if necessary, or a reasonable time to find new housing. It requires HUD to adopt model emergency transfer plans for victims of abuse in its rental assistance programs and to establish policies and procedures under which a victim requesting an emergency transfer may receive a tenant protection voucher.

- The final rule makes it clear that under most circumstances, a survivor to self-certify in order to exercise their rights under VAWA, ensuring documentation does not cause a barrier in a survivor expressing their rights or the protections needed to keep themselves safe. HUD's model emergency transfer documentation is not a barrier to protecting their immediate safety.
1. allows a survivor to self-certify their need for an emergency transfer documentation is not a barrier to protecting their immediate safety;
 2. allows the survivor to determine what is a safe unit for purposes of ensuring that the survivor has control over their own safety planning;
 3. requires housing providers to allow for a resident to move immediately to another safe and available unit that does not require the survivor to go through application process as a new tenant, ensuring quicker access to safe housing;
 4. requires housing providers to explain the efforts they will take when it is safe and available unit available for an emergency transfer and encourages providers to partner with victim services and advocates and other housing to assist a survivor; and
 5. requires housing providers to document requests for emergency transfer, the outcome of the request, and to report annually to HUD.

The housing provider may divide (if feasible) your lease in order to evict or terminate the assistance of the individual who has engaged in criminal assault or perpetrator) directly relating to domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking.

If the housing provider chooses to remove the abuser or perpetrator, provider may not take away the rights of eligible tenants to the unit or other remaining tenants. If the evicted abuser or perpetrator was the sole tenant established eligibility for assistance under the program, the housing provider the tenant who is or has been a victim and other household members to remain in the unit for a period of time, in order to establish eligibility under the program another HUD housing program covered by VAWA, or, find alternative housing.

In removing the abuser or perpetrator from the household, the housing provider must follow Federal, State, and local eviction procedures. In order to divide the household, the housing provider may, but is not required to, ask you for documentation or information of the incidences of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault or stalking.

PROTECTIONS AGAINST THE ADVERSE EFFECTS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Domestic violence can often have negative economic and criminal consequences on a survivor. The perpetrator may take out credit cards in a survivor's name, create credit history, or may cause damage to survivor's property causing eviction or rental history. The perpetrator may force a survivor to participate in criminal history. The perpetrator may force a survivor to participate in criminal history or a survivor may be arrested as part of policies that require arresting on a domestic disturbance. Out for Housing Assistance

Do not pay money to have someone fill out housing assistance application or recertification forms for you.

Do not pay money to move up on a waiting list.

Do not pay for anything that is not required by your lease.

Do not accept for any money you pay. Get a written explanation if you are required to pay for anything other than rent (maintenance or utility fees).

Fraud

Report any information you provided on a HUD housing application or recertification or if someone tells you to provide false information, report that person to the Office of Inspector General. 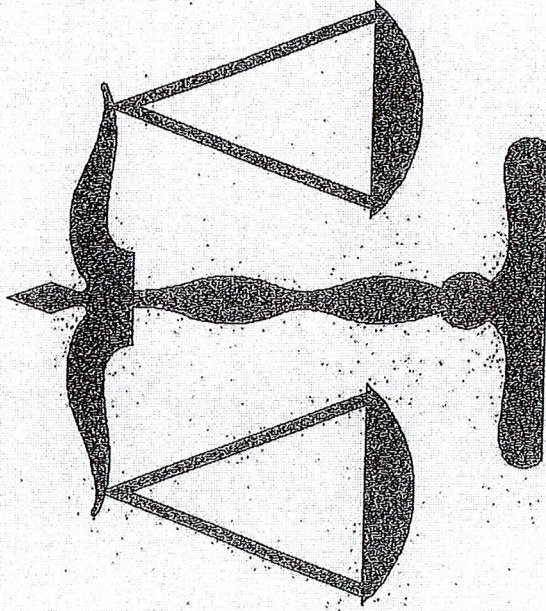

Do You Know . . .

You are committing fraud if you sign a form knowing that you provided false or misleading information.

The information you provide on housing assistance application and recertification forms will be checked. The local housing agency, HUD, or the Office of Inspector General will check the income and asset information you provide with other

Federal, State, or local governments and with private agencies. Certifying false information is fraud.

So Be Careful!

When you fill out your application and yearly recertification for assisted housing from HUD, make sure your answers to the questions are accurate and honest. You must include:

- All sources of income and changes in income you or any members of your household receive, such as wages, welfare payments, social security and veterans' benefits, pensions, retirement, etc.

- Any money you receive on behalf of your children, such as child support, AFDC payments, social security for children, etc.

- Any increase in income, such as wages from a new job or an expected pay raise or bonus.

- All assets, such as bank accounts, savings bonds, certificates of deposit, stocks, real estate, etc., that are owned by you or any member of your household.

- All income from assets, such as interest from savings and checking accounts, stock dividends, etc.

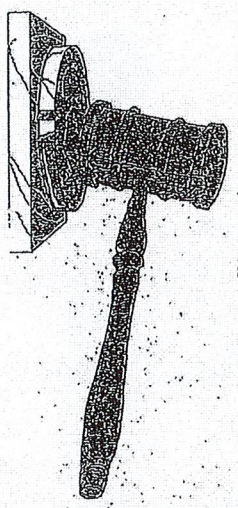
- Any business or asset (your home) that you sold in the last two years at less than value.

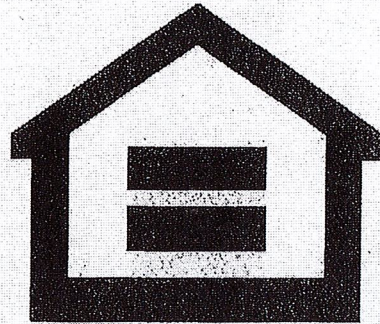

How will this information be used?

PHAs will have access to this information during the time of application for rental assistance and reexamination of family income and composition for existing participants. PHAs will be able to access this information to determine a family's suitability for initial or continued rental assistance, and avoid providing limited Federal housing assistance to families who have previously been unable to comply with HUD program requirements. What are my rights?
